SEASONS GREETINGS!

(We're never too mature to learn something new)

I was recently in a conversation that called for a little more research to explore a question regarding the season of Advent. Let me share the particular answer shortly while beginning with the basics. The season of Advent, which comes from the Latin word *adventus* meaning "coming" or "visit", begins four Sundays before Christmas and concludes on Christmas Eve. Advent marks the beginning of the church's Christian year and calendar.

During the season of Advent, we prepare for and look ahead to the coming of Christ. We also remember the desire of Jews for a Messiah and our own longing for and need of salvation, forgiveness and fresh starts. While looking back with celebration on the birth of our Lord and Savior in a humble stable in Bethlehem, we also are compelled to look forward. We can anticipate the second coming of Christ as the ultimate fulfillment of all that was foretold and promised by his first coming.

It is our custom to celebrate Christmas on a single day. If we look more closely into our Christian tradition and on the church calendar, we'll find the Christmas season really begins at sundown on Christmas Eve

and lasts through the Epiphany of the Lord on January 6th. Hence the term or reference to "the 12 days of Christmas."

Now to that question and conversation mentioned earlier. The color of Advent has traditionally been purple, a color associated with royalty. Some churches have now adopted Sarum Blue from the Medieval Sarum Rite at Salisbury Cathedral in England. <u>WHY?</u> Blue is the color most associated with Mary, the mother of Jesus. I was not aware of this origin.

Let me invite you once again to join us on the journey from Advent to Christmas to Epiphany in seeking to find the star that leads us to the manger in Bethlehem. COVID-19 has changed a lot of things this year. Let's celebrate that we can and will still sing songs of our faith and worship the newborn King!

Read Luke 2: 8-12 as if you are hearing it for the very first time. O Come Let Us Adore Him

Because with faith, I know that I am loved by God and that He has sent: First, Christ to take my sins and send them beyond recovery; Second, the Holy Spirit to be with me wherever I am; Third, the richness of the Bible which presents expert testimony by those who have lived by faith in biblical history. Faith keeps me grounded in God's universe, regardless of the circumstances of my earthly life because I know that the heart of God is boundless, unquenchable love.
